## NAME GAME

Purpose: To help students feel a sense of belonging and get to know each other.

## Steps for Getting It Done:

- Use the Find People Who Have... name grid provided on the next page.
- Give a copy to each student.
- Ask students to go around the room and locate other classmates whose names match statements in the grid.
- Have students record the information learned and the total number of matches they found at the bottom of the page.
- Have a class discussion about what students learned about each other.
